# Delwood Community League AGM

Delwood had their AGM on March 19. We were pleased to see so many people out for this important meeting. At the meeting, the main item of discussion was the Hall Renovation.

We are excited to have the Hall Renovation moving forward this year into the permits and building phase. We expect construction to begin in mid-summer through the fall.

On the executive, we are again in need of a Fundraising Director. We have an incredible team with a great cross-section of skills and knowledge and a willingness to support each other and the community, making most events happen with ease.

**DESIGN CONCEPT B**  
 THE ADDITION WILL HAVE THE ENTRANCE ON ITS EAST SIDE WITH NORTH AND EAST FACING WINDOWS, AND DEDICATED COATROOM LOCATED ON ITS WEST SIDE. BEYOND THE ENTRANCE ADDITION, VISITORS WILL BE DRAWN TO THE HALL BY A TWO-STORY SPACE WITH NORTH AND SOUTH FACING CLERESTORY WINDOWS. ON THE EXTERIOR, THE ENTRANCE ADDITION HAS AN INTEGRAL CANOPY EXTENDED TO THE EAST EDGE OF THE BUILDING. THIS FORM IS CLAD IN HORIZONTAL SIDING WITH WOOD APPEARANCE AGAINST THE HIGHER CLERESTORY WINDOW FORM CLAD IN STUCCO FINISH.

A DECORATIVE FENCE SCREEN IS PROPOSED ON THE EAST AND SOUTH SIDES OF THE FLAT ROOF TO DETER ACCESS. THE FENCE CONSISTS OF REGULARLY SPACED POSTS WITH VERTICAL SCREEN PANELS THAT ARE DIFFICULT TO CLIMB. GATES ALONG THE SOUTH END WILL FACILITATE EXTERIOR ACCESS TO EXISTING MECHANICAL EQUIPMENT. COMPARED TO A SOLID WALL, THE FENCE IS LIGHT, ALLOWS SNOW TO BE REMOVED FROM THE FLAT ROOF AREA EASILY AND SHOULD NOT INCREASE SNOW LOADS.

# What goes where?



## Recycling

Include **ONLY** the items listed here in your recycling

### Paper and Cardboard

- ✓ Newsprint and household paper (not shredded)
- ✓ Magazines and catalogues
- ✓ Non-foil gift wrap
- ✓ Paper egg cartons
- ✓ Paperback books
- ✓ Cardboard boxes (flatten and remove packaging)
- ✓ Pizza boxes (remove liner)



### Plastic

- ✓ Household bottles and containers (e.g. vinegar, shampoo, detergent, margarine, yogurt, clamshells) - please rinse, labels OK
- ✓ Plastic bags (e.g. grocery, retail, bread, dry cleaning) - stuff into one bag and tie closed

### Metal

- ✓ Metal food cans (labels OK)
- ✓ Aluminum trays (e.g. pie plate)
- ✓ Empty non-hazardous aerosol cans



### Glass

- ✓ Glass jars and bottles only

### Beverage Containers

- ✓ Milk containers, juice boxes, beverage bottles, soda cans



**Remember!**  
Remove caps and lids and place them loosely in your recycling.



## Eco Stations



### Free Drop Off

#### Household Hazardous Waste

- ✓ Automotive oil, fluids and filters
- ✓ Batteries (all types)
- ✓ Corrosive and poisonous cleaners
- ✓ Light bulbs (all types) and fluorescent tubes
- ✓ Glues and adhesives
- ✓ Herbicides, pesticides and fertilizers
- ✓ Paints, stains and varnishes
- ✓ Pressurized containers (e.g. propane tanks, fire extinguishers)
- ✓ Syringes (put in a thick plastic container with screw-top lid, like a laundry detergent bottle)



#### Electronics and Appliances

- ✓ Anything with a battery or a cord (e.g. computers, TVs, toasters, stoves)
- ✓ VHS tapes



#### Scrap Metal

- ✓ BBQs, lawnmowers, automotive parts, etc.

#### Tires

- ✓ Passenger vehicle, motorcycle and ATV tires



#### Fees Apply

##### Bulky Items

- ✓ Mattresses, furniture
- ✓ Appliances needing CFC removal (e.g. fridges)

##### Loose or Mixed Waste

- ✓ Construction scrap
- ✓ Soil, gravel, tree roots, stumps, etc.

**Fees:** Bulky items: \$8 - \$15 (size dependent). Appliances requiring CFC removal: \$15. Loose or mixed loads: \$28 - \$48+ (size dependent).



## Garbage

These items do not belong in your blue bag or blue bin

### Food Waste

- ✓ Table scraps, peelings, spoiled food, etc.
- ✓ Cooking oil (up to 1L in a sealed, labelled container. Set beside garbage.)



### Non-Recyclable Plastic

- ✓ CDs
- ✓ Chip bags and candy wrappers
- ✓ Coffee pods and K-cups
- ✓ Food wrap
- ✓ Garden hoses
- ✓ Plastic plates and cutlery
- ✓ Plastic toys

### Non-Recyclable Paper

- ✓ Shredded paper (or take to a recycling depot)
- ✓ Coffee/drink cups
- ✓ Foil gift wrap and tissue paper
- ✓ Paper towels
- ✓ Pet food bags



### Styrofoam

- ✓ All types

### Others

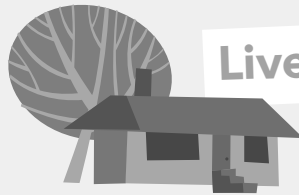
- ✓ Disposable diapers
- ✓ Shoes and worn-out clothing

### Items requiring double bagging

- ✓ Ashes
- ✓ Pet feces/kitty litter
- ✓ Floor sweepings, sawdust and vacuum cleaner bags

### Live in a house?

Remember to set out your waste by **7 a.m.** on your collection day.

Setting out your waste properly keeps your collector safe:

**Keep it light.** If you have trouble lifting your bag or can to the curb, it's too heavy.

**Use the right can.** Smaller than 100 L with fixed handles and no wheels.

**Package sharps.** Put sharps like broken glass, nails and metal scraps in a labelled box.

**Put recyclables in a blue bag.**

Keep them clean - don't forget to rinse your containers!

### Live in an apartment?

Put your recyclables in your apartment's blue bin. No blue bin? Use a Recycling Depot.

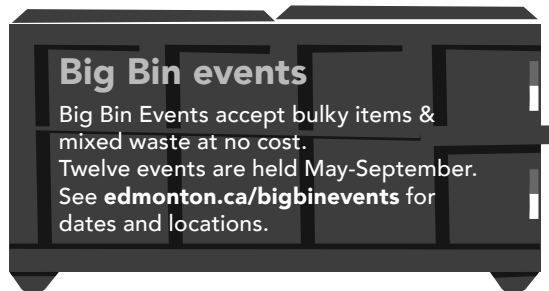
## WasteWise tool

# Bicycle Helmet Safety



Head injuries are the leading cause of serious injury and death to kids on wheels\*. Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. Remember – it's the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

## Getting informed

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent a serious injury, or even save a life;
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death;
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet;
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged.

## Getting started

- Allow children to assist when buying their helmet. Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them;
- Start the habit early. Young children learning to ride tricycles need to wear helmets;
- Parents must lead by example – always wear a helmet when cycling.

## Getting the right fit

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash;
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead;
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To test the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the straps are unfastened;
- Adjust the chin straps to form a “Y” below and slightly forward from the ears;
- Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it is fastened;
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort and safety.
