
Urgently Needed: FACILITIES DIRECTOR

Delwood Community League is in urgent need of a Facilities Director.

Delwood hall, the rink, rinkshack and the fenced ashphalt area are all the responsibility of Delwood Community League. These facilities have been well maintained over the years with an attentive director, hall management, and executive. To continue to offer a great facility for community events and rentals, we need someone who has a flexible schedule and enjoys a bit of tinkering.

General maintenance and handy-person skills are useful, but no specific skills are required since the Facilities Director can call upon outside contractors for any specific maintenance tasks that come up. Groundskeeping, rink maintenance and custodial services are all taken care of by other individuals hired by the league. A key role of the Facilities Director is to coordinate the work of these contractors and workers.

Time commitments can vary based on ability, interest and time availability. There is one board meeting per month, and the Facilities Director will likely be checking in on the facilities at other points in the month as well. 

The U14 Girls entered the Summer Sizzler this year and won a Bronze medal.


U18 Girls: Coach — Chris Spielmann Assistant Coach — Tom Banks Manager — Valeska Spielmann

The U18 girls team "The Scorpions" had a very good outdoor season this year. They played in the top tier on their final round and secured a playoff spot in the EMSA City Championships.


In Cities the Scorpions won their first two games setting up a gold medal match against Glennora where they fell just short and won a silver Medal. Congratulations on a very successful season girls.

Fundraiser Freight's Garden of Souls

Fundraiser Freight (Yes, Freight, not Fright, because the kids wanted a name that would show we bring something to community, not just focusing on the scaring part.) started in 2013 with 9 people and has grown to over 52 people, ages 5-64. We start in February with teambuilding and by June we start props and costume design. All ages do all things. Everyone leads at some point. Making positive choices in life, respecting yourself and others, and taking responsibility are extremely important parts of life.

Our haunt is for everyone. We have a low scare area and even superheros to help overcome some of those fears and push limits a little. Some people come to our haunt for the scare of a lifetime, and we deliver. Last year we joined the Canadian Haunters Association and became a finalist in the Rookie Haunt of 2016, putting us in the "top 5 in Canada."

Our motto is "Anyone can conquer anything with a friend." Cancer patients can fight better and stronger with spirits lifted by a simple hello with a smile or hug.

Staying positive is key. The group has learned how important it is to stay positive as a group and to help one person each day share the vibe of strength and positivity.

Money raised goes to the Alberta Cross Cancer Institute, and clothing or donated items go to Diabetes Canada. Last year, we raised almost \$1800 for the Edmonton chapter of the Alberta Cross Cancer Institute and \$1800+ in clothing and household items for Diabetes Canada.



Who can vote?

You can vote if:

- You present acceptable ID: Alberta Driver's Licence or Identification Card, Personal Cheque or Bank/Credit Statement, Utility Bill (telephone, television, or hydro, gas or water). NOT acceptable: Passport, Alberta Health Care Card, Student or Work ID.
- □ You are at least 18 years of age
- □ You are a Canadian citizen
- □ You are a resident of the City of Edmonton on Election Day (October 16, 2017)
- □ You began living in Alberta on or before April 16, 2017
- □ You have not already voted in the current election

If a candidate, a candidate's official agent or a scrutineer believes you are not eligible to vote, the objection will be noted on the Voting Register, but you will be allowed to vote.

Voting more than once is a punishable offense under the **Local Authorities Election Act**. Offenders face up to six months of imprisonment, a maximum fine of \$10,000, or both.
