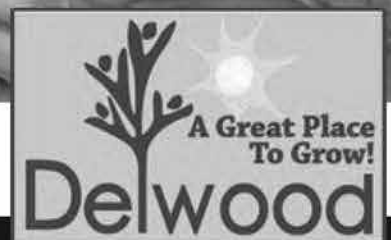
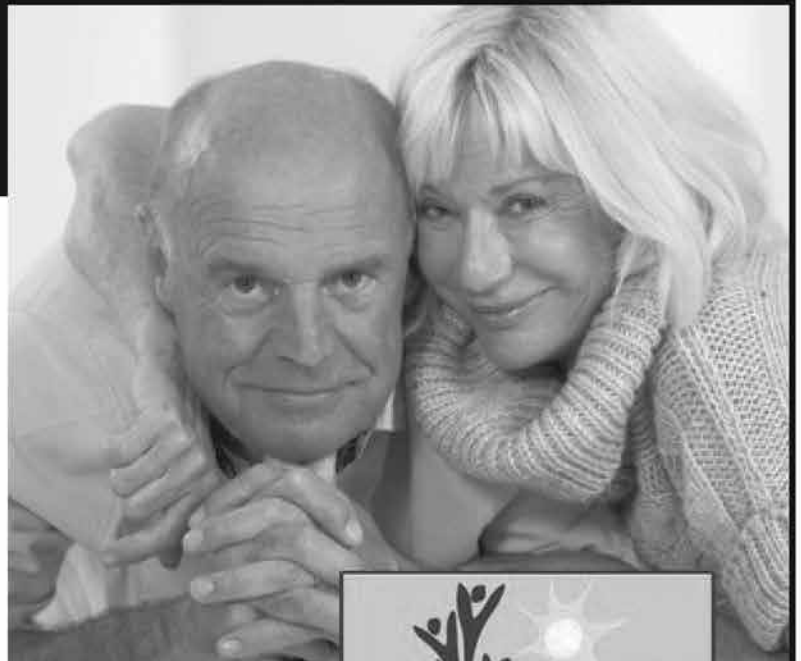

Cannabis 411

Cannabis became legal in Canada on October 17

The Cannabis Act is designed to better protect the health and safety of Canadians, to keep cannabis out of the hands of youth and to keep profits out of the hands of criminals and organized crime.

If you use cannabis, learn how to use it responsibly. Know the health effects. Like alcohol and tobacco, cannabis has risks, especially for youth and young adults.

AT HOME

- Minimum age for purchase and possession is 18.
- Adults may possess 30 grams at any given time; there will be zero tolerance for youth under the legal age of 18 possessing any cannabis.
- You can smoke on your property.
- Each household (not each adult) can grow up to 4 plants.
- Home consumption and grow rules may be different if you rent or live in a condo. Landlord and tenant agreements or condo bylaws can be used to set rules for consumption and growing.
- If you possess cannabis, store and dispose of it away from children, youth and pets.

VEHICLES

- Don't drive high or work impaired. Cannabis can impair your ability to operate vehicles or equipment safely. Driving while impaired by cannabis or any other drug is a serious criminal offence. You cannot consume in a vehicle, including public transport & taxis.
- Cannabis can't be within reach of anyone in a vehicle.
- You can smoke in a vehicle being used as a temporary residence, like a parked RV.

PUBLIC SPACES

New smoking rules are for tobacco and cannabis.

YOU CAN SMOKE OR VAPE:

- In some parks and trails in Edmonton, except as outlined below.

YOU CAN'T SMOKE OR VAPE:

- Within 10 metres of a bus stop or the doorway, window or air intake of a building or patio.
- Within City facilities including Sir Winston Churchill Square, Fort Edmonton Park, The John Janzen Nature Centre, The Edmonton Valley Zoo, The Muttart Conservatory, or William Hawrelak Park
- Inside any building, including bus shelters, LRT stations and cannabis retail stores.
- In a park that contains:
A playground, a sports field, a skate park or bicycle park, an outdoor theatre, an outdoor pool or water spray park, a seasonal skating rink, or an off leash area.
- On or within any:
hospital property, school property, childcare facility property, city-owned golf courses, cemetery, ski hill, bus terminal or LRT platform, or a patio. Different municipalities may have different rules, so check with your local government.

What this means in Delwood

- No smoking on school property.
- No smoking within 10m of the door of any public building or business, including Delwood Hall, Delwood Elementary school, or St. Vladimir's elementary school.
- No smoking on any sport fields or skating rink or in a park attached to a playground (Delwood Park).
- No smoking within 10m of bus stops or bus shelters.

Consider your neighbours. Consider your own safety. And before you light up, know the rules.

Using an ashtray is a joint effort

Never dispose of a cigarette or joint in a plant pot.

Improper disposal is the top cause of fires in Alberta.

Always use an ashtray and fully extinguish whatever you've been smoking.
