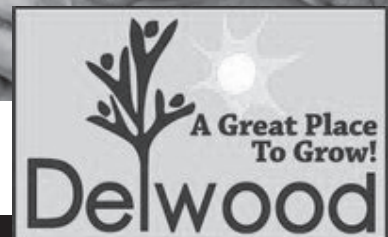
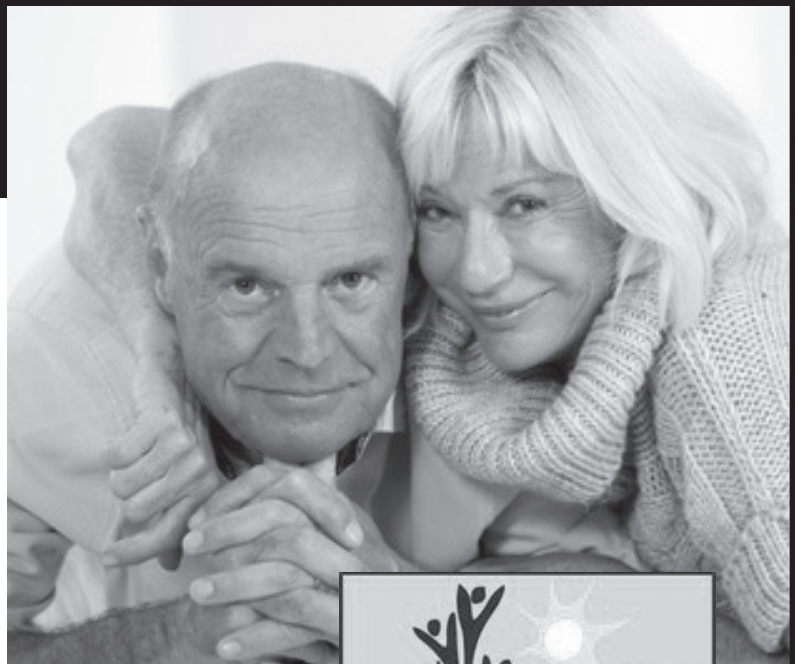

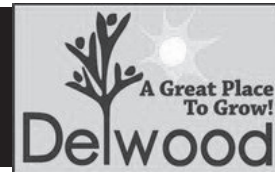

Yielding to Emergency Vehicles

Time is the enemy in an emergency. For everyone's safety, it is important for motorists to understand how to correctly yield right of way to emergency vehicles with lights and siren activated. You can help EMS, police, and fire get to the scene quickly and safely by following these rules of the road.

When an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated:

- If you're in the middle of an intersection when an emergency vehicle approaches with lights and siren activated, safely clear the intersection;
- On a one or two lane road, motorists should move to the right side of the road, slow down, and then stop. Remember to signal;
- On a road with three or more lanes, motorists should move to the nearest side of the road and stop. If driving in the centre lane, move to the right side of the road and stop. Remember to signal;
- Come to a complete stop and wait for the emergency vehicle to pass. Shoulder check for more emergency vehicles (there is often more than one) before re-entering traffic flow. Remember to signal;
- Emergency vehicles might use *any* available road space to maneuver. This could include shoulders or turning lanes, etc., in order to pass other traffic.

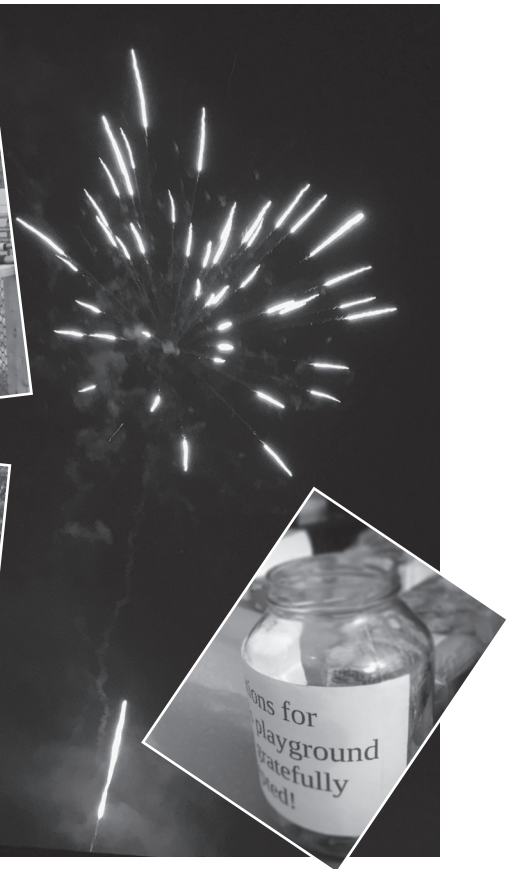
When operating a vehicle:

- It is Alberta law for motorists to slow down to at least 60 km/hour (unless a lower speed is posted) when driving in the lane next to a stopped emergency vehicle, including tow trucks, with their lights activated. If you're not in the lane next to the stopped vehicles, reduce speed and leave lots of space between yourself and emergency personnel.
- Do not break the rules of the road in order to give right of way to an emergency vehicle. This could include proceeding through a red light, or making an illegal turn. Actions such as these jeopardize all motorists in the area;
- Drivers must place their full attention on the roadway and toward the safe operation of their vehicle at all times. The fine for distracted driving in Alberta is \$287.00;
- Always leave plenty of space between your vehicle and an emergency vehicle, should it be required to stop suddenly.

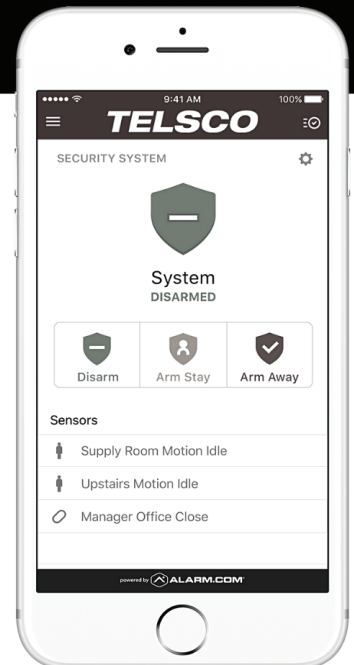

Delwood Cookie Decorating Contest

Soft Cut-Out Sugar Cookies

Prep Time: 2 hours
 Cook Time: 12 minutes
 Total Time: 4 hours
 Yield: 24 3-4 inch cookies

Ingredients

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour, more for rolling and work surface
 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 3/4 cup unsalted butter, room temperature
 3/4 cup granulated sugar
 1 large egg, at room temperature
 2 teaspoons vanilla extract



Instructions

1. Whisk flour, baking powder, and salt together in a medium bowl. Set aside.
2. In a large bowl using a mixer, beat butter and sugar on high speed (2 minutes). Add egg and vanilla and beat on high speed until combined (1 minute).
3. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients. Mix on low. If too soft and sticky for rolling, add 1 Tbsp. of flour.
4. Divide dough into 2 equal parts. Place each onto lightly floured parchment paper. With a lightly floured rolling pin, roll the dough to 1/4-inch thickness. Use more flour if too sticky.
5. Lightly dust one of the rolled-out doughs with flour. Place parchment paper on top. (This prevents sticking.) Place the 2nd rolled-out dough on top. Cover with plastic wrap. Refrigerate 1-2 hours and up to 2 days.
6. Preheat oven to 350°F (177°C). Line baking sheets with parchment paper. Remove dough from the refrigerator. Using a cookie cutter, cut the dough into shapes. Re-roll the remaining dough and continue cutting until all is used. Repeat.
7. Arrange cookies on baking sheets 3 inches apart. Bake 11-12 minutes or until lightly browned around the edges. Allow to cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes then transfer to a wire rack. Cool completely before decorating.
8. Decorate the cooled cookies with icing.

Easy Cookie Icing

Prep Time: 5 minutes
 Total Time: 5 minutes
 Yield: about 1.5 cups icing

Ingredients

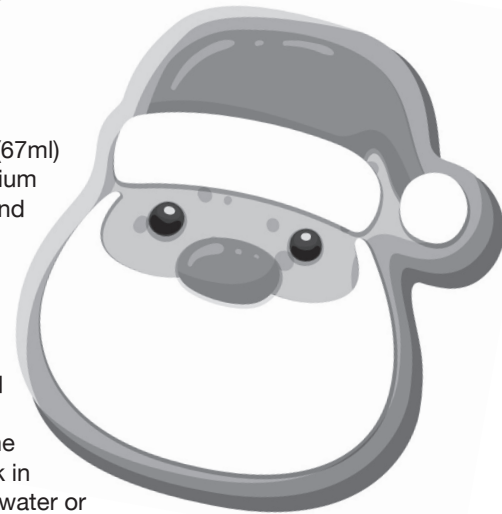
3 cups confectioners' sugar
 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract (omit and replace with water for stark white icing)
 2 teaspoons light corn syrup*
 4.5-5 tablespoons room temperature water
 pinch salt*

Instructions

Using a fork, stir first three ingredients and 4.5 Tbsp. (67ml) of water together in a medium bowl. It will be very thick and almost impossible to stir. Then, whisk in 1/2 Tbsp. (8ml) of water. If you lift the whisk and let the icing drizzle back into the bowl, the ribbon of icing will hold shape for a few seconds before melting back into the icing. If it's too thick, whisk in another 1/2 Tbsp. (8ml) of water or more until you reach the consistency.

You can pour some icing into different bowls if using multiple colours. When tinting icing, only use 1-2 drops at first, stir it in, then add more as needed to reach your desired colour.
